Midgley Community Forum Annual General Meeting

AGM's for Midgley Matters Association Ltd (the Shop), and for Midgley Community Forum (the Community Room and events) were held on 28th February.

The Shop continues to be popular with a turnover of £98,801, an increase of £7,000 over last year, and almost matching the record Covid year. The net profit after paying for goods and expenses was £4,946. This is a tribute to the continuing commitment of all the volunteers, and thanks to the ongoing support of the community using the Shop. More volunteers are always welcome, either to serve in the Shop for an hour or two, or to help with sourcing goods for the Shop. Just let anyone serving in the Shop know that you are interested in helping.

Midgley Community Forum (MCF) is an open organisation that runs the Community Room and arranges events and activities. Everyone living in and around Midgley is automatically a member – there is no joining or membership fee. Last year MCF's activities and events generated an income of over £13,000 and a surplus of nearly £4,000 after all expenses. The main sources of income were the biennial Fete, the Thursday Coffee Mornings, the Quiz Nights and Plant Sales by the gardening group. The weekly Coffee Mornings are hugely popular and we need to expand our serving and baking team. Pop in and let us know if you can help, or know someone who might be willing. (Goods for baking can be obtained free from the Shop). Alistair Grant stood down as Chair of MCF after 15 years and Graham Hill was elected as the new Chair.

During the year, £10,000 was spent on installing the latest item of equipment on the Recreation Ground in conjunction with Midgley School – the climbing frame. At the AGM, new donations of £2,000 towards a new Trim Trail at Midgley School, £500 to CROWS (a volunteer organisation that repairs and maintains local footpaths), and £300 to the Cricket Club for a new junior section were all approved.

All these events and activities need organising, and we really do need more people to help if they are to continue. If you are willing to help with anything even in a small way, please let Graham Hill or Anne Holdsworth know. This could be helping to plan an activity or event, perhaps helping to cook or serve food, or helping with our Open Gardens in June. YOUR COMMUNITY NEEDS YOU!
