Luddenden and Midgley WW 1 Commemoration



A project coordinated by the Luddenden Conservation Society is commemorating each of the forty five WW1 men listed on the war memorial, one hundred years after their death. These commemorations are being attended by relatives, current residents of the homes from which the soldiers set off, ex-servicemen as well as interested villagers from both Luddenden and Midgley.

As well as planting a ceramic poppy cross, there is a two minute silence broken by the tolling of the church bell for each year of the soldier's life, and final prayers.

In due course, we are planning to create a book about the 45 men and what was happening in Luddenden and Midgley during the war.

The next commemoration is at noon on Sunday 17th September for Thomas Henry Sutcliffe of Springfield.
