You will all have noticed the arrival of the Midgley Village public access defibrillator outside the Shop and Community Room and perhaps wondered about how to use it in an emergency.

This training will show you exactly how, when and why you should use it.

Delivered by Jamie Harrop, a Yorkshire Ambulance Service Community First Responder for the Hebden Bridge and Halifax area, the training will focus on dealing with a person found unresponsive and not breathing. You'll come away with confidence in how to use this excellent new village asset should you ever need it, along with further experience of CPR.

Two training sessions will be available and each last around 1 hour.
