Some of you may have noticed a lot of work going on around the community building recently.

The paintwork around the outside of the building has been smartened up with a new lick of paint and repairs done to some of the exterior woodwork. As a step towards reducing our carbon footprint in the village, we have installed 28 solar panels on the roof.

These are expected to generate about 9000kWh per year and will contribute towards the electricity needed in the Community Building.


Many thanks to Bracken for putting up with the inconvenience this work has caused.
